Spelling Mastery / Maths Mastery (JEMM)

AVPS have continued with the Spelling Mastery program in all classes from Years 2-7. Spelling Mastery is an evidence-based program focusing on teaching students spelling skills and rules that they then apply to numerous base and root words. Every word or generalisation that is taught through Spelling Mastery is constantly reviewed to ensure long-term retention and transference to writing. Students will not be asked to memorise list words, but rather learn the skills and generalisations that apply to the English language. Due to the success students are experiencing with Spelling Mastery, teachers have supported the introduction of Maths Mastery in Years 2-7.

Preparing for year 7 in high school in 2022

This year marks the start of a new phase for our education system, as we finalise our preparations to welcome your year 6 or year 7 child to high school in 2022.

Schools are working incredibly hard to ensure they are prepared for the move of year 7 to high school. As a department, we are making sure that your school has all the support they need to make this transition smooth and successful for you and your child.

This is a special year for students

It is a unique year, as year 6 and year 7 students will for the first and only time end their primary school journey together.

We want your child to have a positive experience in their final year of primary school. We understand the importance of rites of passage, such as graduation ceremonies, and our primary schools will do their very best to make this a memorable occasion for both year 6 and year 7 students.

Enrolling in high school for 2022

This year, families of year 6 and year 7 students will both be applying for and enrolling in high school through the department's statewide transition process.

You will receive details from your primary school early this year about how to apply for and enrol in your local public high school, so I encourage you to keep an eye out for this key information.

If you are unsure of which high school zone you live in, you can use the 'Find a school' tool on the department's website at www.education.sa.gov.au/7toHS

Engaging with your new school

There may be opportunities for you to connect with your child's new high school before next year.

Schools will generally have open days, information sessions or principal tours for prospective families to learn about the unique programs, systems and offerings of the high school.

As the situation with COVID-19 continues to change, schools will operate in line with the latest SA Health advice, which may mean alternate and innovative ways to engage. This might include activities such as virtual tours and online webinars. I encourage you to explore how to engage with your local high school by visiting their website or social media pages, or contacting the school directly.


We are working together

Easy Recipe Idea - Vegie pikelet sandwiches

Ingredients:

1½ cups self-raising flour
1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour
2 eggs, beaten
1 ⅓ cups reduced-fat milk
1 medium carrot, peeled & grated
2 handfuls baby spinach, finely chopped
1 small onion, grated
225g tin corn, drained
2 tbsp fresh dill, chopped
1 tbsp olive oil
3 tbsp reduced-fat spreadable cream cheese

Method:

Place flour into a large bowl and whisk in the eggs and milk until smooth. Add the vegetables and dill and mix to combine.

Heat the olive oil in a non-stick frypan over a medium heat. Spoon in rounded tablespoons of mixture into the pan and smooth them into round shapes.

Cook until the mixture bubbles and is golden on the bottom. Turn and cook other side. Repeat with the rest of the mixture and cool all of the pikelets.

Once cooled, spread half the pikelets with cream cheese and top each with another pikelet to make sandwiches.

Makes 24 pikelets.

Preparation time: 20 minutes

Cooking time: 20 minutes

Serves: 12
